

PROACTIVE COMMUNICATION

If you know that your child(ren) will not be attending camp on a specific day, prior to that day please send a note to let us know. If your child wakes up ill, please let us know your child is not attending as soon as possible.

We will do our best to communicate issues that occur at camp to you in the most timely manner. We would appreciate the same from camp families. If there is a change in your household situation, family routine, etc please let us know so we can help your camper adjust.

Dress for Camp...A Few Tips & Expectations

- Dress your child(ren) in comfortable clothing that can get dirty! **TRIPLE C CAMPERS HAVE FUN WHILE GETTING DIRTY.**
- **LABEL EVERYTHING WITH FIRST AND LAST NAME!**
- Campers should wear their bathing suit to camp daily, girls underneath their clothing, boys as their shorts. This helps us spend more time swimming and enjoying water activities!
- **We require all campers to wear enclosed shoes everyday.** They are safe for running and the variety of camp activities we enjoy.
- Please send a bag/backpack daily, **clearly marked with first and last name.**
- Campers will need to bring a lunch and a minimum of two snacks with them each day.
- The bag should contain underwear and clothing to change into after swimming/being wet, a water bottle, a towel, a hat, and sunscreen. The sunscreen must be **labeled with camper name**, and we suggest it be in a Ziploc type bag. Please apply sunscreen to your camper in the morning and we will oversee the reapplication throughout the day. Due to allergies and sun sensitivities you must send sunscreen each day. (Lotion sunscreen preferred)
- Dress appropriate for weather (i.e. windbreaker, sweaters, sweatshirts for cold windy days-packed if not worn; and a raincoat for rainy days-we have indoor facilities, but we move about camp).
- **Campers will need to bring 2 masks with them each day, both with campers first and last name on them. Masks must have an attachment device to secure to their person. We suggest a carabiner or break away lanyard.**
- PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR WATER BOTTLE!
- If you choose to send insect repellent we ask that it be in lotion form and **labeled with camper's first & last name.**
- **Colt Camp participants** will need to bring pants to wear while they ride. We will provide a helmet for each camper to wear for the session. Colt campers may bring their swim suits vs. wearing them in the morning.



Bus Mail & Email

What's That? Bus Mail is a note addressed to the appropriate person and given to the Bus Captain, it is then delivered to the Office and on to the addressee. In areas that require "follow-up" the staff member associated with the request, will follow-up and respond to you as soon as possible.

Use Bus Mail when: you wish to note a special arrangement about pick up or drop off, there will be a prolonged absence from camp, you require an answer to a specific question, or you are sending in a payment.

Bus Behavior

Keeping the children safe is our number one priority. In order to ensure a safe ride we must be firm about behavior during transportation. If a camper is misbehaving on the bus (i.e. foul language, disturbing fellow campers, disregarding safety rules) the following steps will be taken:

1. A verbal reminder as to appropriate bus behavior
2. A phone call to the parents
3. Suspended from the bus for the following day
4. Expelled from the bus for the remainder of the summer

TRANSPORTATION



If You Bring Your Child To Camp

Morning Drop off time is 8:15am-9:00am. Staff will greet your camper in the transportation loop to check them in. A health screening and temperature check will be done at this time. We ask that the camper's window is rolled down and everyone in the vehicle is wearing a face covering. Once a child has been cleared the staff member will assist them with exiting the car and getting them to their group. Unless registered for the Early Drop Program, campers brought before 8:15am are to stay with their parents in their car until we begin check in.

Early Drop begins at 7:30am. Staff will greet your camper in the transportation loop to check them in. A health screening and temperature check will be done at this time. We ask that the camper's window is rolled down and everyone in the vehicle is wearing a face covering. Once a child has been cleared the staff member will assist them with exiting the car. Campers are welcome to bring breakfast with them. Campers must be pre-registered for this portion of the camp program.

Late Arrivals Please park by the Dining Hall/Office and a staff member will come out to greet your car. We ask that everyone in the car be wearing a face covering, the camper's window is rolled down. Campers will have a health screening and temperature check done. Once checked in, staff will take your campers to their group. All campers are expected to follow the program schedule for which they are enrolled.

Picking Up Your Child From Camp During the Camp Day Campers who need to leave early **MUST BE PICKED UP** before 4:00pm. This is to ensure the safety of every camper. Call 434.293.2529, email register@tripleccamp.com or send a note with the Bus Captain to let us know of any early pick-ups. Advance notice allows us to have your camper(s) at the office ready for your arrival.

When you arrive at Camp please park by the Dining Hall/Office, stay in your vehicle, wear a mask, and a staff member will greet you at your car. To ensure campers safety, transporting adults will be required to have verbal communication with a staff member before leaving the camp property.

Registered Camp Pick up in the afternoon is 5:00pm-5:45pm. Due to bus traffic this is a strict time line. Upon arrival to camp you will be directed by staff to the designated pick up zone to ensure camper safety.

Late Pickups For parents who are late picking up their children, either at the bus or at camp, there will be an additional charge of \$2.00 per minute for the extended care service. Payment will be due the following day.

In the case of an emergency such as inclement weather or natural disasters parents will be notified as soon as possible on when/how pick up procedures will take place.



BUS TRANSPORTATION

Triple C Camp Buses are generally yellow with purple stripes and camp signs. We may also utilize additional community buses, in which case they will have camp signage and camp staff. Each morning campers and one adult (wearing masks) must make their way to the camp bus for a health screening and temperature check. Once a camper has been cleared, they will load the bus and sit in their assigned seat. To adhere to COVID-19 regulations, there will be one camper per seat, unless siblings. Masks will be worn at all times while on the camp bus. Once the bus arrives to camp, it will be offloaded front to back. In the afternoon, campers must be greeted at the door of the bus by their parent/guardian or authorized person for the highest level of safety.

Our buses run on schedule. When it is time to depart the bus will leave. If you are late in the afternoon, your child will remain with the camp staff until efforts to reach parents have been made. If necessary child(ren) will be brought back to camp where they can be picked up. **For parents who are late picking up their children, either at the bus or at camp, there will be an additional charge of \$2.00 per minute for the extended care service. Payment will be due by the following day.**

BUS LOCATIONS

The Park at UVA, look for the buses in the parking lot next to the fields
The Park at UVA I: morning 7:50am-8:00am afternoon 5:10pm-5:30pm
The Park at UVA II: morning 8:20am-8:30am afternoon 5:10pm-5:30pm

Crozet, look for the bus at Western Albemarle High School, 1st lot on right.
Crozet: morning 8:00am-8:10am afternoon 5:15pm-5:30pm

Fashion Square Mall, the bus will be in the SOUTH lot, south of the former JCPenney.
Fashion Square Mall: morning 8:00am-8:15am afternoon 5:15pm-5:30pm

Pantops, the bus will be located in the lot near the flagpole, behind Jiffy Lube.
Pantops: morning 8:00am-8:15am afternoon 5:10pm-5:30pm

5th St. Station, the bus will be located in the lot near Haverty's and Planet Fitness.
5th St. Station: morning 8:30am-8:40am afternoon 5:00pm

Changes in the scheduled transportation must be made in advance and in writing to the Camp Office. **All transportation changes must be approved by Camp Administration and are subject to a \$45 fee.** If you know that your child(ren) will not be attending camp on a specific day, prior to that day please send a note or email to let us know. If your child wakes up ill, please let us know your child is not attending as soon as possible.

Things from home

Parents are asked to **KEEP AT HOME** personal items such as books, toys, trading cards, electronics such as cell phones & ipods, or money unless specifically requested to do so for a special event. Families are responsible for any items their campers bring to camp. **Super soakers or weapons of any kind are to be KEPT at home.** Teen Scene campers may use personal items when deemed appropriate by camp staff. However, it is understood these items may be confiscated if this Teen Scene privilege is misused. Families are responsible for any items their campers bring to camp.

Please make sure all items brought to camp are labeled with the campers first and last name.



Our Staff Commitment during COVID-19

Our staff are mature individuals who choose to work at camp for the positive impact camp makes on the lives of everyone involved. Our staff have committed to be mindful of their personal activities, to limit contact with people outside of our staff circle, and to adhere to all the local safety guidelines. Our staff trainings will continue to focus on growth and development of our campers, creating a supportive and fun atmosphere. While we will be eliminating high fives, we will be true to our mission.

Visitors during the camp day

Triple C Camp facilities will be closed this summer to all visitors Monday through Friday. Only essential visitors (plumber, electrician, etc.) will be permitted with prior arranged clearance from the Camp Director or Health Directors. Approved essential visitors will be required to go through all health screening and temperature check procedures, wear a face covering and maintain moderate social distance from all campers and staff members.

Triple C Swimming is FUN!

Our two pools and multiple depths offer flexibility for both teaching and free swim. Younger campers, Pioneer & Trailblazers (K-3rd grades), improve their swimming abilities while participating in the American Red Cross Learn To Swim Program.

Explorers (4th-6th grades) and Teen Scene (7th-10th grades) campers will have the opportunity to play group games in the water and enjoy recreational swim time. Campers swim under the direct supervision of Red Cross Certified Lifeguards.

Triple C Swim Policy: Campers must be able to swim the length of the pool and tread water for one minute before swimming in the deep end or using the diving board and/or slide of that pool. Any camper with hair to their shoulders or longer will be required to have their hair pulled back for safety.

ADDITIONAL END OF DAY SWIM LESSONS

Additional swim lessons are available for campers of all ages. Campers K-3rd grade have lessons in their day camp program. **ADDITIONAL LESSONS** are offered in **TWO** week sessions, **MON-THURS** from 4:00pm to 4:30pm. PM transportation continues as registered. Camper groups may mix during this activity. These are semi private lessons and are \$150/session (Payment due with lesson registration). REFUND PROTECTION POLICY

Entitles you to a full refund of all deposits and fees of applicable sessions. Cancellation must be made, in writing, 5 business days prior to the start of the camp session. Once enrolled in refund protection, the fee may not be transferred between sessions. Refunds will only be made to those enrolled in refund protection. Cost is \$50/one week session and \$100/two week session and due at the time of registration (non-refundable).

Campers bring a lunch and at least two snacks with them to camp each day. To ensure physical distancing while eating, campers will eat outdoors, weather permitting, across the camp property with their small groups. Hands will be washed thoroughly with soap and water before and after lunch.




The Sun – It Can Be a Hot Item!

Triple C Camp has established some specific policies that protect our campers from the effects of exposure to the sun's rays and still allows them to enjoy the out-of-doors. Our staff is vigilant and wants to help our campers protect themselves by doing the following:

- Wear a hat!
- Wear protective clothing--light colored and loose.
- Wear waterproof sunscreen--minimum SPF 15 and apply 30-60 minutes before exposure. Remember ears, tops of feet, and the neck. Use sunscreen in hazy, cloudy, and foggy weather. Re-apply sunscreen regularly.

Our staff will monitor reapplication of sunscreen to campers K-3rd grade, we will verbally remind older campers throughout the day.



Health Services

All Triple C Camp staff members are put through First Aid Orientation. Our Health Care Specialists will attend to minor scratches, cuts, and bruises. There is also a Registered Nurse on site. If additional care is needed, campers will be taken to UVA Health System Hospital unless the injured campers group is away from camp. In the case of minor illness, we will make your child comfortable and call you to arrange a pick up at camp. If parents intend for someone other than persons indicated

in the Registration process to pick up their child at any time, they must submit the names, addresses, and phone numbers of these individuals to the camp office in writing, via bus mail, email, or fax.

Your Campers Health

COVID-19 guidelines: Please refer to our COVID-19 specific section on the webpage.

General childhood communicable diseases have always been a concern to us in camping. Illnesses such as chickenpox, conjunctivitis, strep throat, and others occur. We must follow the Virginia Department of Health's *Communicable Disease Reference Chart For School Personnel*, in determining communicable exclusion. If your camper, or ANY member of your household, is exposed to or contracts any communicable disease during the season you are required to notify us IMMEDIATELY. This communication will allow us to notify the applicable families that may also be affected. Your family will have anonymity.

Staying Home When Appropriate

Campers need to stay home when the following has occurred: Contact with a person with COVID-19 within the last two weeks. If they have tested positive for COVID-19.

If they are showing COVID-19 or other medical symptoms such as: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.

Medications

Except under unusual circumstances medication should be kept at home. If medication is to be administered at camp or held at camp for emergency purposes (ie. Epi Pens, inhalers, Benadryl), please follow these guidelines:



Prescription and nonprescription medication shall be given only with a completed written authorization form (see link below) and appropriate signatures. All medications must be in their ORIGINAL CONTAINER with the current prescription label or direction label attached. Medication must be labeled with the child's name and be current. Loose or unpackaged meds are unacceptable. Physician signature may be required based on the duration of the medication distribution.
